Thought for the day

The mysterious and holy nature of the one true God is beyond our understanding, but it is both communal harmony and individual personality, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Readings

Isaiah 6:1-8
Psalm 29
Romans 8:12-17
John 3:1-17

Aim

To learn about God from the wind.

Starter

Go outside and feel the wind. Work out where it's coming from, and watch what it does to such things as a piece of thread, a balloon, our clothes, and blown bubbles.

Teaching

Come back inside and sit in a circle, talking about the wind. What did it feel like on our skin? What did it do? Was the wind real? Could we see it? No! The wind and air are invisible, but we know they are very real. How? Because we can feel the wind and see what it does.
The wind is very useful because it can teach us about God. Like the wind, God's love and closeness to us can't be seen, but it is very, very real. We can feel that God loves us. We can see all around us the beautiful world God has made. Like the wind, we can see the good things God does.

Praying

I can't see the wind
but I can feel it's there.
I can't see you, Lord God,
but I can feel your love!

Activities

Using the sheet they can make a prayer wheel to hang in the wind, and there is a windy day picture for them to look at and colour, spotting the things the invisible wind is doing.
